A Message from Our Pastor



Lent is coming to an end. As I age Lent seems to get shorter every year, and many of the things I planned to do get forgotten. One thing I never forget and always cherish are the liturgies of Holy Week. In the past they were often nearly private affairs with very little community participation. Thankfully, that has changed. If you are able to do so, it is important to try to participate.

They are the key moments of salvation. We proclaim Christ has died, Christ is Risen, Christ will come again. We gather with Jesus in the upper room to begin a salvific journey. Jesus leaves a gift for us to be shared for all time - His body and His blood. In John, Chapter 6, we are told people walked away because he told them that "unless they ate His body and drank His blood you cannot have life in me". Sadly, that is still the case today. Many see the Eucharist as some sort of symbol but not real.

The gospels challenge us to believe that Jesus is really and truly present in the Eucharist. That is the belief since the last supper. We must pray like St. Philip Neri, "Lord I believe, help thou my unbelief."

Good Friday, Jesus dies on the cross after unbelievable suffering and cruelty. Once again humanity's inhumanity is on display. Most of His followers run away. Darkness and despair. "Into your hands I commend my Spirit". It's a time for reflection and prayer.

Easter Day the unexpected: an empty tomb. Belief and unbelief and the challenge put forth, "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned". We still have the belief as we welcome new believers and first communicants. We still have the unbelief and the challenge to go out to the whole world. Yes, Lord I believe; help thou my unbelief.

Words from the Heart – Dear God, dinners are more than just sharing food. They're times to help us get to know each other. We will always cherish our family mealtimes together. Amen.

USF Welcomes International Speaker Br. Michael Perry for Sustainability Presentation

Joliet, Ill. – The University of St. Francis (USF) welcomes international speaker Br. Michael Perry, OFM, for a special one-hour sustainability presentation to the community on Tuesday, April 25, beginning at 7 p.m. The presentation, Addressing Sustainability: Becoming Partners with Creation for the Sake of the Poor and the Planet, will take place in the Moes/Presidents Room in Tower Hall on USF's main campus, which is located at 500 Wilcox Street in Joliet. Virtual access through Zoom will also be offered.

"Pope Francis told me the only way forward for humanity is for people to abandon the temptation to exercise control over land and peoples and to pursue the path of holiness, the path of becoming saints. That path, said the Pope, that journey, is made by seeking sincere human friendship, fraternity and solidarity. I suggested this is what it [means] to becoming 'Saints.' The Pope told me this is a very good thing to do," Perry said. The presentation is being made possible through the Catholic Franciscan Charism Council and Sustainability Committee efforts, free of charge.

About Br. Michael Perry, OFM

Brother Michael Anthony Perry, OFM, is a Midwestern American Franciscan friar who from 2013-21, served as General Minister of the Order of Friars Minor, the 120th successor of St. Francis of Assisi. Currently, he is the Franciscan Scholar in Residence and Director of the Laudato Si' Center for Integral Ecology at Siena College in New York. Perry also worked at the International Office of Justice and Peace at the United States Conference of Bishops and at Catholic Relief Services, and at Franciscans International, which works on human rights, poverty, peace, and integral ecology at the United Nations. For ten years, Perry also worked in the manner of St. Francis as a missionary in the Democratic Republic of Congo. He also taught cultural theology and global Catholicism at Washington Theological Union in Washington.


Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal 2023




Triduum: A Spiritual Pilgrimage
