a Message from Our Pastor



I recently spent time in London, UK. I stayed with a cousin and had lunch with other cousins. I enjoyed doing that, but this was not the main reason for my visit. I was there because Deacon Vic Puscas was among the 48,000 running the marathon.

Most of those 48,000 runners were not running for fame or prize money. Some were running because of a personal desire or challenge. Most were running for a charity and to make life better for others. Vic was running for visually impaired youth. He raised money through family friends and colleagues so that someone could have a better chance in life. To me, he and others were living out the Gospel. "This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." John 13:35

He was disciplined and put himself through a vigorous regime in order to run 26+ miles for others. I can no longer even run 100 yards. So why was I there? I was there to support a friend but also to say "thank you" for his example and discipline. I know Vic does not want any of this, but because of him I can ask the question: What have you done to support others?

And I can answer somewhat, because St Francis Xavier has a fine example of outreach through Daybreak and other activities sponsored by individuals and the Knights of Columbus. Thank you! We are always looking for ways to improve and welcome any suggestions. Congrats, Vic! We will support your efforts, but not all of us can make running as seemingly effortless as you.




Women's Bible Study: Bathsheba Story


Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal 2023




